1. Intellectual property (IP) pertains to any original creation of the human intellect such as artistic, literary, technical, or scientific creation. Intellectual property rights (IPR) refer to the legal rights given to the inventor or creator to protect his invention or creation for a certain period of time. These legal rights confer an exclusive right to the inventor/creator or his assignee to fully utilize his invention/creation for a given period of time. Indian laws are successfully protecting these rights under various domains of IPR by inculcating the minimum standards established by various international documents. Discuss and critically evaluate how these domains are different from each other.
